Jane Clutterbuck is an Associate Professor at the College of Health and Sciences at the University of Massachusetts, Boston and a graduate of Brandeis University. Her research interests center on health care disparities, diversity in health care, minority aging, and qualitative research.

Honors include a Research Fellowship at the Research and Training Institute, Hebrew Rehabilitation Center for Aging, and appointment as a Distinguished Practitioner in the National Academies of Practice.

Dr. Clutterbuck's teaching experience includes cultural diversity in health care and policy-related issues in health care disparities. She developed the Clutterbuck Minimum Data Matrix (CMDM), a theoretical model for community health nursing education, research, and practice. The CMDM is also applicable to teaching and research in nursing and health policy.
